INTRODUCTION

The idea for **RULES TO LIVE BY** came in 2018 after the death of one of my greatest idols, Mark E. Smith of the band The Fall, whose collaboration with Michael Clark led me to train as a dancer. Beginning as a spontaneous tribute dance in front of 200 people on the night of his death, it has grown into a requiem for heroism, hedonism, rebirth and dark disturbing humour.

A celebration of transformation, a bid to be unforgotten, a dance of rules, constriction, sugar highs and suffocation, *Rules To Live By* is a rebellious aspiration to a hero's punk anarchy.

who was a punk in-her-own-right. She is the hero, the stalwart, my personal Vivienne Westwood, the treasure hunter and the curio-with-a-cause.

This double-bill veers between anarchy, punk music, heroism and how idolatry and loss can shape a life.

In line with Suzi's creative practice, this double bill has been crafted for presentation in alternative and unexpected spaces. Previous spaces include an art gallery, a derelict office, Aberdeen's Anatomy Rooms and a church hall.

SUZI CUNNINGHAM

is a Scottish live-performance artist and Scotland's foremost female Butoh artist. With each new concept, she creates and presents performances that are bespoke and responsive to its unique environment, enriched by her sense of design, voice and movement.

Suzi's work is highly physical, and she explores relationships with manufactured materials, making embodied connections to objects in a way that borders transformation.

Through Butoh dance, Suzi explores the archaeology of the body and its interdependence with the natural world. Her work has a strong ecological and political focus, exploring how the primal body meets the modern world.

... begins with a striking serenity.

A deep red carpet runs like a runway up the centre of the stage. To the right side, there is a table with red curtains. On the left, there is a coat hanger, with a long red coat. The coat begins to move, until it slides off the hook and music blasts.

"I'm alive!"

A red figure is revealed, like a floating doll, then breaks into parts as if made from plastic.

An aged figure, then life begins again, in a flourish with a puff of ash or seed that is pulled out of the flesh.

Running. Flailing.

Life flashing before in picture like poses.

Desperate. Late. Until exhausted, a body dragged lifeless under the table.

Singing can be heard.

The sound of Sondheim and movement from within.

Then the curtains open like a theatre and reveal many floating faces, turning, changing, rising up, distorting, being crushed.

The piece ends with the continuous motion of faces trying to make their individual appearance known.







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Suzi Cunningham

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RULES TO

... begins with Suzi walking into the space in a bright orange tracksuit.

She functionally sets up the stage with a plastic sheet, a mirrored wall, and a small shiny structure.

Suzi is precise and has to make things balance.

She then goes to walk away and she stops.

She is dragged back, a force pulling her clothes off until she is almost naked, and pulled under the plastic, to the words of '15 Rules to Live By' by George Carlin.

At Rule number 15, the scene changes.

She then pulls herself up through the middle of a concealed hole in a sheet, entering into the shiny structure, she becomes it, transforming into shapes like a moving shiny disco ball, as 'Flooded' by Vin Sudended blasts out.

She then finds a tin of treacle, pouring it on and into herself and then birthing out of the cloth into a shining female, gathering her plastic dress, she walks off resplendent, happily delirious in gooey delight.
